Luna Maxis Director Presidents Report 2022 and 2023

In 2022 the BTA was back in action after a two-year hiatus due to Covid 19. We hosted our National Championships in May and went to Carifta in Bermuda in November. In 2023 we also hosted our National Championships as well as hosted Carifta for the first time.

Events:

2022

National Championships which also served as a qualifier for the 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham, England.

Commonwealth Games saw Armando Moss compete and finished 38th. This is the third time we have had someone compete in the Commonwealth Games.

Carifta was held in Bermuda, we took a 22-member team and finished 5th, tied our highest place, only 3 points separated 3rd from 5th.

2023

The National Championships incorporated Aquathlon for the first time as a two day event, which was used a test event for Carifta. The winners in male and female overall were both junior athletes.

CAC Games - Armando Moss was our lone participant.

Jr Commonwealth – we had two participants – Erin Pritchard and Launy Duncombe.

Carifta Bahamas – our highest finish ever 3rd, with our first gold medal ever.

Sanctioned Events

Along with Beautiful Bahamas (Seawaves), The Conchman was officially sanctioned this year by the BTA.

Development and Training:

In 2022, the Coaches Community course was developed to bridge the gap between noncertified coaches and Level 1 coaches. This was developed for new coaches, parents and athletes. We have had over twenty certified so far.

I have enjoyed my time as president since 2015 as there have been many ups and downs, mistakes made, and lessons learned. Each time we have done our best to change, address, establish policies, procedures, laws, and rules to best serve the sport and community. After a successful Carifta event along with profits made from timing events, we now have a healthy bank account. I love to see a national circuit with points being earned in all sanctioned events to have a highpoint winner, have Nationals scored to announce a team winner. I would love to see more gold medals after Carifta and more participants in Junior Commonwealth Games, Jr Pan Am Games, Commonwealth Games, CAC Games, Pan Am games, Continental Cups, World Triathlon events and of course the Olympics.
